State Conference News

The South Carolina Housing Officers Association will be holding its annual conference in Charleston, SC on November 5, 2004 at the Charleston on the Beach Hotel on Folly Beach.

In keeping with tradition, it will be a one-day conference featuring speakers, three program sessions, and lunch. The theme this year is "SCHOA: Lead with Vision." Final conference preparation and program selection is currently under way.

The Fall for Leadership Conference was held at Clemson University on September 25, 2004. Several student leaders and resident assistants from across the state attended.

Napolean Melton, the Director, shared a lot of information with me over the last few months. He compiled a very comprehensive report on the doings of SCORE. Below are the highlights:

Mission of SCORE:

SCORE is an organization that develops, plans, initiates, executes, and encourages programs and communication which promote the public interest and the social welfare of resident students across the state. SCORE acts as the regional voice of resident students residing in colleges and universities across South Carolina.

The member institutions include Clemson University, Furman University, Lander University, University of South Carolina – Columbia, Coastal Carolina University, Benedict College, Presbyterian College, and Winthrop University.

SCORE 2004 Conference

The SCORE 2004 Conference was held at Clemson University on February 6-7, 2004. The theme of the conference was "B.R.I.D.G.E the Gap to SCORE." B.R.I.D.G.E was the acronym for Building Residents in Diversity, Growth, and Education. Approximately 60 students from Winthrop University, USC-Columbia, Furman University, and Clemson University were in attendance. At this conference, there were three constitutional changes made. These changes included; adding web responsibilities to the secretary position, a requirement for the conference committee to have a formal update to the board three times a year, and a requirement that all board members be in good standing with their respective institutions. Lastly, the board reported that they unveiled a new SCORE pin, used to honor members who have contributed to the success of SCORE.

SCORE 2005 Conference

The SCORE 2005 Conference will be held at Furman University on February 4-5, 2005. The theme for the conference is JUNGLE, which stands for "Jointly Uniting Neighbors for a Growing and Learning Environment." The SCORE 2005 Conference Staff is in place. The conference staff consists of its RHC Executive Board. Each member of Furman's RHC Executive Board is in charge of each of the different aspects of the conference. Rod Kelley is the Conference Chair as well as the Business Relations Chair. The SCORE 2005 Conference Staff is currently working on assigning different people to contact schools about making plans to put SCORE 2005 in its budget. They have a list of 21 schools to start contacting.

No Frills Meeting

The No Frills 2004 Conference was held at Georgia Tech in Atlanta, Georgia on March 19-21, 2004. The theme of the conference was "All Roads Lead to the ATL – Acknowledging Talented Leaders." Winthrop University, USC-Columbia, and Clemson University were in attendance at the conference. Out of the 7 bids that were submitted from our state, 2 bids won at the conference. Winthrop University won the Dan Hallenbeck Service Award in honor of their RHA Advisor, JT Timmons, for his service to not only Winthrop but to the region. Winthrop also was awarded the chance to host the No Frills 2005 Conference at their university. Winthrop University submitted an application to coordinate Roll Call for the SAACURH Region during the NACURH 2004 Conference. Clemson University submitted an application to coordinate Spirit Packs for the SAACURH Region during the NACURH 2004 Conference. Winthrop and Clemson applications were selected to coordinate stuff for the region at the NACURH 2004 Conference

SCORE also held a transitional board meeting on April 2-3, 2004 and an on-line board meeting on April 18-19, 2004.

There were 25 students from Clemson, Winthrop, and USC-Columbia in attendance at the NACURH 2004 conference in St. Louis, MO.
